CAN MY PET GET COVID-19?

There is no evidence that pets are becoming infected with Covid-19. CDC and World Health Organization have stated that there are not reports of pets or livestock becoming ill or spreading the Covid-19 in the U.S at this time.

WHAT SHOULD I GET FOR MY PETS?

During quarantine you should make sure you prepare a kit with at least 2 weeks worth of food and 1 months supply of your pets medication and pet emergency items.

Pets should not leave quarantine unless you are forced to separate. Pet should be washed prior to entering new home for care or facility. This will help eliminate contact germ transfer from infected owner.

WHAT PAPERWORK SHOULD I HAVE FOR MY PET?

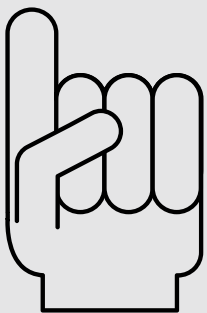
In any disaster it is advised to keep all medical records, microchip number, emergency contacts for care and vaccination certificate.

SHOULD I AVOID MY VET, GROOMER OR PARKS?

Veterinarians are taking all precautions. If pets are sick drop off to limit exposure to others and wash your hands. Avoid dog parks and any other unnecessary pet areas at this time to limit your contact with people.
